## <u>IDENTIFICATION REQUIRED FOR OBTAINING DEATH CERTIFICATE</u>

(In order of best acceptability)

### PHOTO ID (MUST MATCH FACE ON CARD TO PERSON'S FACE)

- 1. An UNEXPIRED state issued driver's license.
- US or foreign passport, visa, national identity cards issued by US government to foreign nationals.
- 3. An expired version of 1. or 2. listed above.
- Employment photo ID issued by the federal or state or local government, including military or a photo ID card from a government sponsored program. (NO business ID's, NO student ID's).
- 5. Major credit card with a photo of the card holder.

#### NO PHOTO ID AVAILABLE

- 1. Major credit card(check name and signature on card against name and signature on application)
- Motor vehicle registration card (check name and signature on card against name and signature on application)
- 3. State social services program card (check name and signature on card against name and signature on application.
- 4. Current utility bill or pay stub with name and current address. VITAL RECORD MUST BE MAILED TO THAT ADDRESS.
- If person requesting certificate is accompanied by someone who does have acceptable PHOTO ID, a signature affidavit attesting to the person's identity can be accepted along with a copy of that photo ID.
