**CORRIDOR H
PARSONS TO DAVIS
TUCKER COUNTY**

The West Virginia Division of Highways (WVDOH) is reactivating the NEPA process and will hold an informational public meeting on Tuesday, August 20, 2019, at the Blackwater Falls State Park Conference Room, located 1584 Blackwater Falls Road, Davis, West Virginia on the proposed Corridor H- Parsons to Davis Project. This component of the 100-mile Appalachian Highway Corridor H involves construction of an approximately 10-mile new location, four-lane, divided highway, with partial control of access, between the City of Parsons and the Town of Davis in Tucker County, West Virginia. The project begins east of Parsons, 0.2 mile north of the intersection of Tucker County Route (CR) 219/4 (Mackeyville Road) and United States Route (US) 219, which is also the eastern terminus of the Kerens-to-Parsons Project. The project ends north of Davis along WV 93, 1.3 miles east of WV 32, which is the western terminus of the Davis-to-Bismarck portion of Corridor H. This meeting complies with the public involvement requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.

NO FORMAL PRESENTATION WILL BE MADE. The scheduled public meeting is from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. and the public will be afforded the opportunity to ask questions and give written comments on the project throughout the meeting.
